COURSE DESCRIPTION

This class is an integrated program that utilizes reading, writing, speaking, and listening. Reading instruction will expose students to a variety of thinking strategies. Written communication will include narrative, informative, and argumentative writing. Speaking and listening will provide opportunities for collaboration and discussion.

GRADING

Grades will be based on daily assessments that will include forms of writing, inquiry/research, collaboration, and discussion, as well as tests and projects that are designed to show students' mastery of the content. Students will have multiple opportunities to reach mastery on each standard. Grades will be assigned as follows:

Students may correct Minor and Major grades up to a 70 within 1 week if the original score was below a 70. Students are responsible for completing their corrections in a timely manner and respectfully emailing the teacher with the name of the assignment that was resubmitted.

CLASSROOM PROCEDURES During Class Start of Class

ABSENCES

If you are absent, it is your responsibility to check Google Classroom and speak to or email the teacher about what you missed. You will not receive extra class time to complete an assignment. You may make arrangements to come and work after school or in WIN (what I need). Do not assume you can stay any day of the week. Arrangements must be made with the teacher at least 1 day prior. Students will be given one day per day that they are absent, following the A/B block schedule.



INDEPENDENT PRACTICE

All students should be reading a book of choice at home and during SSR, however, there is no time requirement or reading log for at-home reading. Students will be required to complete journal entries and give book talks in response to what they have read. Students are also encouraged to use study hall periods to complete work.

Students may need to bring projects and essays home depending on how much they were able to complete in class. If students bring home any other independent assignments, it would be because they did not finish it during the provided class time.
