MISSION

The mission of Boerne High School is to educate and empower all students to excel academically with a strong sense of global and technological awareness, to guide students to develop into compassionate citizens with strong character and to equip students with the skills to become life-long learners.

SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

BISD was founded February 8, 1907. It is located 25 miles northwest of San Antonio, covers 365 square miles and encompasses parts of Kendall, Bexar and Comal counties. The rural and suburban areas that make up the school district have approximately 40,000 residents. The district consists of seven elementary, three middle schools and two high schools which accommodate approximately 9,500 students. Boerne High School was opened in the 1970s as a public four-year secondary school and is accredited by the Texas Education Agency. BHS has an approximate enrollment of 1,365 students in grades 9-12.

CLASS RANKING

Boerne ISD is a non-ranking school district. Students are given a numerical ranking only when they are notified if they qualify for automatic admission to a Texas public university or college. Class grade averages are calculated at the end of each semester. BISD assigns weights to semester grades earned in eligible courses and calculates a weighted numerical grade average, in accordance with the following:

Advanced Courses = Multiplied by 1.1 On-Level Course = Multiplied by 1.0

Adjusted grades are used in computing GPA and class rank, but numerical grades on the transcript do not reflect added points. GPA is calculated on a 100% scale and provided as a weighted average only.

GRADING SCALE

All grades are recorded numerically. Transfer grades are recorded using the numerical equivalent on the grade scale of the sending school. Otherwise, grades are translated as follows: A 90-100 B 80-89 C 70-79 F Below 70

DUAL ENROLLMENT

Boerne High Students have access to dual enrollment classes in English III, English IV, Accounting, College Algebra, Precalculus, Calculus, Statistics, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Geology, Astronomy, Environmental Science, US History, Texas Government, US Government, Psychology, Sociology, Philosophy, Communication Applications, Art Appreciation, and Music Appreciation. These courses are offered to students through partnerships with Northwest Vista College, part of the Alamo Community College District, Angelo State University, Tarleton State University, and the University of Texas OnRamps program. Most of these courses are taught by BISD faculty members on one of our high school campuses while some are offered directly through the college in an online platform.
