- We will use Google Classroom to have a digital record of everything we do and to aide us in creating a digital portfolio.
- I understand Google Classroom is not for my personal life, but is a part of my art classroom.

Content - Is This Mine?

- I will only post material that I create myself. I will not post any material that I copy and paste from another source made by other people.
- I will not post material that includes classmates or myself that I do not have permission to share.
- I will only post material that is school appropriate.

Tone - SCHOOL RULES!

- School rules apply when using Google Classroom.
- If you aren't sure if it is okay to post, then it probably isn't.
- No sarcasm. No bullying. No gossiping.

Posting - Stay on Topic

- I will post a question to the group only if it applies to the group. If the question only applies to me, I will only post or message my teacher.
- I will not knowingly answer a post with false information.
- If a question posted to the group is answered correctly, I will not repeat the answer.

<u>Language - This isn't texting</u>

- Spell words out completely. No txting lingo. im ur teacher...show me that u have learned how 2 spell.
- Please please please don't type words more than once.

Safety - Nothing Personal

- No numbers, addresses, emails, last names, etc
- No logins or passwords.

Reporting - Heads Up

 If you feel something has been posted or exchanged that is inappropriate in any way, you will immediately report it to your teacher.
