respect your art supplies & properly clean up materials, table, and art room carefully *art jobs!!!*




respect yourself as an artist, respect your artwork (be brave)

• OPEN SKETCHBOOK QUIZZES: Quick online quiz every week on the notes you will take during Warm-Ups over Art History and Vocabulary. You'll also upload a photo of your weekly Sketchbook Assignment to this online quiz. (This is designed to encourage students to learn and implement strong note-taking skills that are beneficial to all of their academic courses).

TECHNIQUE TRAINING: Art students will learn so many new techniques crossing over all different mediums. Often, students will complete short Technique Training exercises to have them practice these new skills.

• PROJECTS: Art projects will focus on specific techniques and art mediums while also highlighting learned Elements of Art and Principles of Design.

EVERY PROJECT IS GRADED BASED ON THE FOLLOWING:



CONTENT: project instructions, originality, and creativity

CRAFT: craftsmanship, use of technique

CONCERN: effort and focus, planning, use of time

CRITIQUE: self-reflection, taking good care of materials, helpful and kind to peers & behavior

We learn more from our mistakes than we do from our successes, and a willingness to admit we have room to grow is the hallmark of any great artist. If you get a grade back you're not happy with, don't stress out simply consider its critique or ask for help, then resubmit! Even an 'F' can jump to an 'A" if you're willing to give it the time and effort it demands! Do I lose points for late work?

Yes.... UNLESS you have discussed an extension opportunity with Mrs. Kallie by filling out the "Extension Request" form *before the due date to avoid grade penalties.*

Life gets overwhelming sometimes, both at school and at home, I'm here to help! Just keep me in the "know" and we'll help you succeed without falling too far behind. I'm not the best artist... will I struggle?

This question, I'm afraid, is a wrong one. Artistic skill is learned, not inherited (& science will back me up). No one enters a math class expecting to receive a grade for what they already know & an 'F' if they don't understand the next semester's worth of material they haven't yet heard about. In art class, one is graded on the application of fundamentals covered in class & their work ethic, NOT personal style or skill level. Students will document their artwork nicely using the mini photo studio we have in the Art Room. Students will learn how to label their images in the class Google drive and share them to their school Google account.

These uploads will serve multiple purposes- online exhibitions, classroom instagram, individual student portfolios, and official submissions of artworks for a grade.

open studio

Every Friday, students will have Open Studio. They will have the ability to choose what type of artwork they would like to investigate that day. They may choose individual projects, collaborative artworks, investigate a new technique or specialty, or continue their assigned projects.

Art is a great privilege and functions the best when we meet our studio expectations built around respect. If any expectations are broken, the following restorative steps will be taken:
