Definition: Long Range Facilities Planning Committee (LRFPC)

- Cross-section of the community, including parents, faculty and staff, students, business owners and civic leaders.
- Commissioned by Trustees, invited by superintendent, led by community representative.
- Engaged in a process that examines relevant data, discusses challenges and solutions, and makes recommendations to Board of Trustees on long range facility solutions and funding to support those solutions.
- Supported by BISD staff and Huckabee representatives in advisory capacity.

Why a Community-Centered Committee?

- BISD is a public entity. Each committee member is a stakeholder. Each member represents thousands of stakeholders throughout the district.
- The power of collaboration and working through a process serves BISD well, has produced great results previously.
- Each member brings a unique perspective. When combined with a knowledge base provided by industry experts, results tend to reflect community values, needs and desires.

LRFPC Charge & Scope

- Represent the entire community in the facility planning process
- Assist the district in assessing and prioritizing current and long-term facility needs
- Explore opportunities to address those needs in accordance with the following guiding priorities:
 - Building age, safety and condition
 - District growth and capacity
 - Evolving educational delivery

LRFPC Charge & Scope

- Build on the long-range plan that charts a course for the district's future
- Make recommendations to Board of Trustees including the possible need for a bond initiative

Introduction of Members

- Name
- Profession/role in the community district
- Children in the district, past or present

Role of Committee Chair

- Lead each committee meeting according to the agenda, making adjustments where necessary
- Facilitate large group discussion and seek to build consensus
- Assure all ideas and/or positions are heard and given equal opportunity for expression
- Keep Committee focused and on task
- Serve as Committee spokesperson before the Board of Trustees for preliminary and final presentations

- Approximately 12,400 residents and 7,880 students Nine schools:

 - Two Middle Schools (Grades 6-8):
 - Boerne Middle North and Boerne Middle South
 - Five Elementary Schools (Grades K-5):
 - Cibolo Creek Elementary, Curington Elementary, Fabra Elementary, Fair Oaks Ranch Elementary and Kendall Elementary

District Snapshot in Time

- 18% Economically Disadvantaged
- 4% English Language Learners
- 31% At-Risk
- 96.2% average daily attendance rate
- 99% graduation rate for 2014-15

Work Completed

2012:

- District strategic plan crafted by citizen committee
- LRFPC builds master plan & bond package

2013:

- Voters approve \$99.5 million bond
- Bond projects begin immediately and continue throughout 2014-15

Work Completed

2015:

- Technology long range plan developed
- Demographic study commissioned
- Vision for BISD Learner developed by citizen committee
- Huckabee engaged for facilities assessment
- Board calls for new LRFPC


