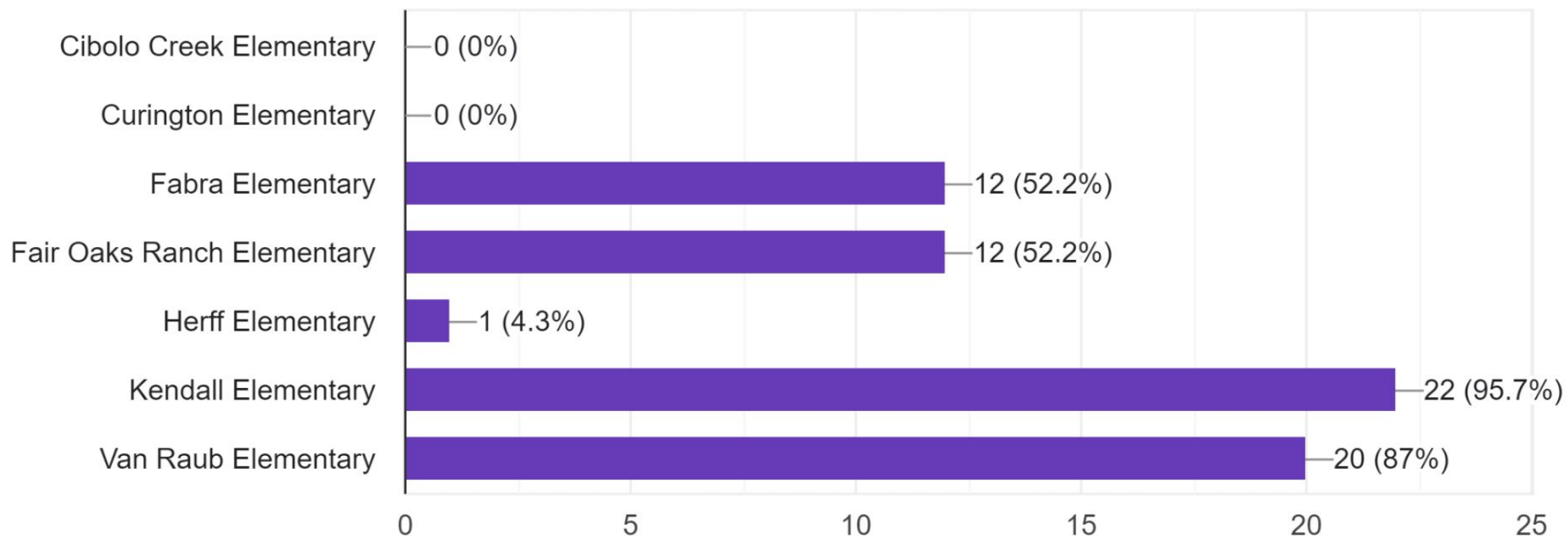
The CBC is an ad hoc advisory committee, representing various stakeholders of the district community.

Considering the geography of our district, what areas or neighborhoods make sense to include in the new Viola Wilson Elementary zone?

- Areas West of I-10
- Areas west of I-10 and south of 46
- Some of Kendall and Van Raub and potentially Fabra
- Planning Units 19, 21, 22a, 22b, 24, 23
- Van Raub subdivision the side of I10 where Wilson is.
- Left side of 10 to Toutant Beauregard, Regent Park, Boerne Stage Rd.
- Planning Units 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22a, 22b, 33, 24, 25a, 25b
- Planning Units 23,19,22a,24,22b,21,20 maybe 25A&B
- Corley Farms, Windwood Estates, Balcones Creek Ranch

Based on prior boundary changes, what areas or neighborhoods should we avoid including in the Viola Wilson Elementary zone?

- The areas that were just recently rezoned three years ago

- Planning Unit 26 or Menger Springs area
- I feel all schools closest to 10 needed to be considered
- Don't move VRES kids across I-10
- Planning Unit 20. There aren't any backroads to the new house and they have to go on frontage road and pass Van Raub on the way.
- Planning Units 13,15,and 26
- We need stay open to shifting boundaries to balance school population.

Guidance for Selecting Boundaries

- Consider campus enrollments and capacities
- Consider travel times and roadways
- Avoid splitting neighborhoods
- Look to use natural boundaries for dividing lines (major roads, green spaces, creeks, etc. where possible)
- Minimize changes to current middle school and high school zones
